

Boxwood GM Plant Demolition and Removal of Asbestos Containing Materials Fact Sheet

1. To Date, NO Federal or State Agencies Have Found ANY Asbestos Violations at Boxwood.
2. Federal and State Agencies Dictate Permissible Exposure Levels to Asbestos: It is 0.1 Fibers per Cubic Centimeter for Long-Term Exposure and 1.0 Fibers per Cubic Centimeter for Short-Term Exposure.
3. The Asbestos Removal Contractor at Boxwood, ECO Services, Hired Outside Testing Firms (As Required by Federal Standards) to Test the Asbestos Exposure Levels of their Employees and to do perimeter air sampling at Boxwood.
4. The Long-Term Exposure Levels Ranged from **0.008 to 0.013** Fibers per Cubic Centimeter – This is **10 to 100 Times LESS** than the Government Standard.
5. The Short-Term Exposure Levels Ranged from **0.002 to 0.004** Fibers per Cubic Centimeter – Again **10 to 100 Times LESS** than the Government Standard.
6. **Bottom Line:** NO Exposure Risks to Workers / NO Exposure Risk to Neighbors.
7. Given the Irresponsible Allegations by the Union that the Local Community was at Risk, Our Company Hired an Independent Testing Firm to complete “Fence Line Testing.” This Test Determines if There Are Any Airborne Exposure Risks To the Surrounding Community. The Testing was Conducted on April 6 and April 10 at Three Locations:
 - (1) Centerville Road and Boxwood Road
 - (2) Champlain Road and Read Road
 - (3) Dodson Avenue and Boxwood Road

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8. The Test Results Found **<0.003 to 0.008** Fibers per Cubic Centimeter — All Results were **100 Times Less** than the Government Standard.
9. All “Fence Line Testing” Will Be Made Available On a Dedicated Website.
10. The Union Has Been Picketing at the Property Line at Boxwood on a Daily Basis If They Truly Believed Their Own False Allegations, Why Haven’t They Been Wearing Protective Equipment? Because They Know that the Allegations Are False Scare Tactics (including misleading photos and video) – not Factual Truth.
