

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Strategically located off of Route 141 and I-95 in Northern New Castle County, Delaware.

Current redevelopment efforts led by HHA position the Industrial Park directly next to a newly planned Newport River Trail (further connecting to City of Wilmington, Old New Castle and Delaware City), planned Downtown Newport Mixed-Use Redevelopment and newly planned commuter SEPTA rail stop.
